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Familiarization on board - more than just a statutory exercise

The purpose of the instruction is to familiarize crew members with safety-relevant and individual activity-related aspects on board. The obligation is subject to various regulations such as the STWC Convention or the ISM Code. On the one hand, the implementation fulfills legal requirements and, on the other hand, ensures that the crew members are informed and carry out their activities in a safety-conscious manner. In this way, they make a direct contribution to accident prevention and the avoidance of financial losses. The scope of the instruction respective familiarization always depends on the type of ship and its operations, it can be roughly divided into the following sub-areas:

- 1) Initial familiarization, which has to be carried out before the ship departs (such as tasks according to the muster list, muster stations, alarm signals, life-saving appliances, fire protection equipment).
- 2) Activity-related familiarization in the working and living areas of the crew member (e.g. workplace, work equipment / systems, operational processes on board, watch keeping, emergency procedures).
- 3) Further safety instruction in the handling of life-saving appliances and fire-fighting equipment within the first 14 days (see also SOLAS III Reg. 19.4).
- 4) Management-related instruction in the safety management system, environmental protection, energy management and other topics.

Furthermore, the rank on board determines the scope of familiarization. Not everyone has to be able to do everything. Officers usually have to pay more attention and obtain more responsibilities on board than ratings.

It is the duty of the shipping company to appoint a person to carry out the instruction and to define objectives in order to prevent a generalized and overloaded procedure. The shipping company should make the necessary information available to those entrusted with the instruction and should ensure that the administrative work for documentation and signing is kept to a minimum.

Objectives:

- Which objectives to be achieved for which rank on board?
- What is needed to achieve these objectives?
- Which method do I use to convey this content & when?
- How can I relieve the workload on board?

The initial phase of the boarding of a crew member can lead to a flood of information. As a shipping company, make sure that crew members can understand and reflect on content at a later point in time - e.g. through suitable documentation. It is more than just a statutory exercise.

In the following, you will find an overview of possible training topics that should be expanded to include individual details as well as individual issues relating to the cargo, the ship and the equipment.
